What is Youth Mental Health First Aid?

Youth Mental Health First Aid is designed to teach parents, family members, caregivers, teachers, school staff, peers, neighbors, health and human services workers, and other caring citizens how to help an adolescent (age 12-18) who is experiencing a mental health or addictions challenge or is in crisis. Youth Mental Health First Aid is primarily designed for adults who, regularly interact with young people.

You will learn:



- Common mental health challenges for youth, reviews typical adolescent development
- The potential warning signs and risk factors for anxiety, depression, substance use, disorders in which psychosis may occur, disruptive behavior disorders (including AD/HD), and eating disorders
- 5-Step Action Plan (ALGEE) for how to help young people in both crisis and non-crisis situations
- Resources available to help someone with a mental health problem.



Youth Mental Health First Aid Classes will be scheduled on-going throughout the year.
