Dr. Ferrans developed the Ferrans and Powers Quality of Life Index, has conducted studies on the quality of life and disparities in healthcare for over 20 years. She developed an instrument to measure cultural beliefs contributing to late-stage diagnosis of breast cancer in African Americans and Hispanic Women.

Dr. Given's nursing research career has focused on long-term cancer care and survivorship. A pioneer in oncology nursing, Dr. Given's research identifies how patients can be assisted to manage patient adherence and symptom management.

Dr. Canady developed a research trajectory in health disparities, emphasizing the social context of mental and physical illness in women. She has published and presented broadly in the areas of health inequities, cultural competence, and social justice.

Dr. Talley's research focuses on the influences of quality of life among underserved populations within the context of chronic illness. Her current research focuses on the functional status of older African American long-term breast cancer survivors.

Mary Smania has nearly 30 years of experience in Nursing and over ten as a Nurse Practitioner. Mary works within the healthcare system as a patient advocate, collaborating with other providers.
